### **Mandatory Student Fee Advisory Committee** Thursday January 26, 2012

Crescent Room, Student Center Commons, 3:00 P.M. to 4:30 P.M.

- 1. Attendance There were eleven Committee members and two alternates present, per the attached attendance sheet. Twenty four additional staff and students were present, as listed in the attendance list.
- 2. Review of Meeting Summary December 9, 2011 The Committee voted to approve the meeting summary from December 9, 2011 by consensus.
- 3. FY2012 and FY2013 Budget Update Jim Kirk shared the latest information with the Committee members on the status of the Georgia Tech budget for FY2012 and the FY2013.
- 4. Presentation of Mandatory Fee Requests for FY2012

**NOTE**: The voting forms required by the Board of Regents are appended to these minutes. The increases voted by the Committee are summarized in Attachment 2. The President concurred in the Committee's recommendations and forwarded these to the Board of Regents on February 1, 2012.

- Transportation Lance Lunsway presented the Transportation proposal, with a request for an increase of \$2, from \$76 to \$78 to provide the current service level. Elle Creel made a motion, seconded by Austen Edwards, to recommend to the President a \$5 increase in this fee. This increase would include \$2 to cover the cost of maintain the current level of service provided and an additional \$3 to provide additional late night service to help improve student safety. The Committee voted unanimously to approve the motion.
- Student Health Gregg Moore presented the Student Health proposal to increase the fee by \$9, from \$154 to \$163. Charley Crosson made a motion, seconded by Brooke McDaniel, to recommend to the President an increase in the fee by \$6, from \$154 to \$160. The Committee voted unanimously to approve the motion.
- Athletics Dan Radakovich presented the Athletics proposal to increase the fee by \$5, from \$127 to \$132. James Black made a motion, seconded by Alex Walker, to recommend to the President that this fee be maintained at the current level. This motion was passed by a vote of nine in favor, two against and one abstention.
- 5. Next Meeting Jim Kirk thanked the Committee for its work. Students will discuss whether they wish to reconvene the Committee later in the semester to discuss other mandatory fee issues.
