CARES Act Institutional Emergency Relief Funding Distribution Plan <u>Georgia Institute of Technology</u>

In June 2020, Georgia Tech received \$5,194,038 in CARES Act Institutional Aid from the U.S. Department of Education. In order to provide direct benefit of these funds to current and future students, Georgia Tech used this funding to partially restore Spring 2020 semester student fee refunds in Housing, Dining, Campus Recreation, Student Activity, Student Center, Transportation, Parking and Living Learning Communities. Utilization in this way will mitigate negative impacts to operating reserves in these areas, allowing for additional COVID-19 risk mitigation investments in support of student health and safety, and reducing the likelihood of commensurate rate increases in subsequent years.

Spring Semester student fee refunds totaling \$16.3 million (excluding Athletics) are detailed below, along with the approved plan for utilizing CARES Act Institutional Aid to fund approximately 32% of these refunds.
